Blue Ribbon Commission (2018-2019)


From the Commission Report:

Broad Theme #4: Build a strong standards ecosystem

"Establish a highly functional professional certification program that incorporates pragmatic implementation of the standards, not just learning theory and rules. Require regular knowledge updates to maintain certification credentials. Individual certification (1.) improves homogeneity of implementation; (2.) expands the pool of qualified job candidates available to the community; and (3.) may provide a substrate for company-level certification demonstrated by a critical mass of individual certifications"

- 5: Special Purpose Domains
- > 6: Controlled Terminology, Conformance and Other References
- 7: The Trial Design Model
- 8: Relationships Among Datasets and Records



Knowledge and Skill Statements

Knowledge of the requirements for the use of the --OBJ variable with Findings About events or interventions Knowledge of when to use Findings About Knowledge of the different references that would be needed when creating a new domain Skill to create a custom domain Findings About, Custom Domains, Associated Skill to recognize data that are about an associated person rather than a study subject Persons, and Study References (10%) Knowledge of considerations for creating an Associated Person (AP) dataset (e.g., family medical history, caregiver questionnaires) Knowledge of the situations for which additional identifiers may be needed (e.g., identifiers for devices, identifiers for non-host organisms) Knowledge of the Device Identifiers (DI) dataset used to establish identifiers for devices that are used to populate the variable SPDEVID Knowledge of the Non-host Organism Identifiers (OI) dataset used to establish identifiers for organisms used to populate the variable NHOID



CDISC Tabulate Exam Items (Questions)

Domain 4: Findings About, Custom Domains, Associated Persons, and Study References

A custom domain should be established around

- A. A specific collection method.
- B. A specific set of timing criteria.
- C. Observations with a common topic that do not fit into an existing domain.
- D. An efficacy endpoint that fits well into an existing domain but should remain separate for analysis.

Certification Changes Since 2021 Pilot

Qualification and Maintenance

- Eliminated experience requirement
- · Removed maintenance fee

Prep and Delivery

- Practice questions
- Streamlined virtual environmental checks
- Shortened exam (185 -> 125 questions)

Results

- Instantaneous
- Performance Analysis (for non-passing candidates)

Discounts

- Membership Discounts (40% Platinum / 20% Gold)
- Group Discounts (10+ Enrollees)

Certification Exam Fees

\$500 exam fee

\$125 re-test fee (for failed exam)

Passing exam grade establishes certification for 3 years

Recertification required after 3 years

Recertification exam fee: \$500
