CDISC diffusion status in Japanese academia

CDISC diffusion status in Japanese academia

- Results of CDISC Implementation Questionnaire for Japanese AROs (Apr - Jun/2020)^{**1}
 - CDASH, SDTM, or ADaM have not been implemented: 65.9%
 - Number of Data Managers: Median=3, Minimum=0, Maximum=28
 - Obstacles to implementing CDISC standards
 - Human and economic effort required, lack of resources: 85.4%
 - No personnel with knowledge of CDISC:61.0%
- CJUG/SDTM Shin-Ahiru-san Team (launched in Dec 2022)
 - Applications flooded in for "Academia Volunteer Members who want to be CDISC compliant but have been unable to do so".

It's not that ARO staff in Japan aren't interested in CDISC, it's just that they want to implement CDISC but are unable to do so.

Current Status of ARO in Japan

- Japanese AROs' role is to assist the investigator in clinical research.
 - AROs are attached to hospital organizations, many organizations are staffed co-medicals and do not have computer science specialists.
 - Small size, little funding and staff.
- Even the ARO staff members who participate in Shin-Ahiru-san team only attend about an hour once a month as a web conference, and the rest of the time they must study on their own.



We need materials that enable ARO staff, who are not computer specialists and whose native language is Japanese, to learn CDISC on their own in a fun and enjoyable way without losing their minds.



Why can't they implement CDISC standards?

 Lack of Japanese materials for entry level people to study on themselves.

Polarization of CDISC?

- Pioneers
- People who can't get over the barrier

Features of CDISC Neko-channel

The CDISC Neko-channel is a collection of short videos aimed at beginners who have no knowledge of CDISC, as well as beginners who have studied it a little.

- Most of them are short videos of less than 3 minutes.
 - The viewers can watch them in your spare time and never get bored.
- It is provided by Neko-chan personally.
 - Since it is not an organizational operation, there are no meetings or proofreading, and we can provide information quickly and with free ideas.
- Rather than Neko-channel teaching viewers various know-how about CDISC, viewers watch Neko-chan teaching the ignorant girl Zunda-chan.
 - The viewers can easily view them without feeling inferior.
 - It can add humor to the videos.
- There are currently 33 short videos on CDISC Neko-channel.

Male? Female? For instance, even if we receive data like this, we won't understand what it means.




The birthdate order isn't clear, and when it says '1' in the sex column, we can't tell if it's a male or a female.

Like this, they set rules for item names, order, date formats, and even using 'M' for males and 'F' for females in gender. Once they established these rules, trials won't be all over the place, and we won't have a hard time understanding the data, right?

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


